Phoenix Explorers Report 2019-20

Duke of Edinburgh's Award

As well as the weekly Phoenix Explorer activities, the unit also runs a successful Duke of Edinburgh's Award. Training activities take place on Thursday evenings when needed throughout the year, with weekend expeditions being organised between March and the end of October. This year, we had two expeditions: A bronze level expedition took to the hills of the Peak District where the group hiked for two days and camped overnight at Hazel Barrow Farm. During the weekend, they were assessed by County D of E Assessor, Mick, who was thoroughly impressed with their determination and skill on display.

Young Leaders

The Young Leaders Scheme is available for all young people aged 14 to 18 in Scouting and enables them to volunteer to help out in the younger sections. Currently, we have eight explorers who are also Young Leaders and provide support across our Beaver and Cub sections. During the last year, they have had the opportunity to undertake several training <u>course</u>, including first aid and a series of modules specific to the Young Leaders Scheme.

Charity Abseil

In September, members and leaders of Phoenix Explorers participated in an exhilarating abseil from Millers Dale Bridge in Derbyshire. Throughout the morning, participants got the opportunity to do two abseils. While doing so, they raised money for *Stone Lion's Prostrate Screening Programme* and *Climbers Against Cancer*. Well done to everyone who took part.

Queen's Scout Success for Shay

Before Christmas, we were very proud to see Shay Norman, a member of Phoenix Explorers, gain his Queen's Scout Award, the highest award in Scouting. The award requires the recipient to complete a variety of components, including a three night, four day expedition and a residential experience, amongst others. Shay's hard work towards the challenge over his time as a young person in Scouting culminated with a very honest and humorous presentation to over 50 people, including his explorer unit and officials from the District and County. Now 18, Shay is a leader at Mohican Cubs, continuing to inspire and motivate others. Well done, Shay!

Milldale Campsite Activities

Twice during the year, Phoenix Explorers visited Milldale Scout Campsite on a Monday evening to take part in a variety of activities, <u>including</u>: competing in a race over the assault course; <u>s'mores</u> around the campfire; and a host of wide games, such as Capture the Flag.

Team Challenges

During the year, members of Phoenix Explorers were tasked with working in teams to compete in a range of challenges. One of the most notable and successful events was a cooking challenge, where the groups were given £5.00 to go out and buy the ingredients for a nutritional meal. They then had to return to the hall and cook it – all in less than an hour and half!

Escape Rooms

To develop teambuilding skills, and have fun, Phoenix Explorers visited Escape Rooms in Newcastle-under-Lyme to try their hand at the live puzzle game. With some of the rooms being more challenging than others, some escaped and some <u>didn't</u> but everyone had a great time all the same.

Night Hikes

Once each term, Phoenix Explorers takes to the local fields and footpaths for an evening hike. Over the last year, they have walked from Mow Cop and Sandbach, as well as completing some challenge hikes in the area directly surrounding Alsager.

Giving Back to the Community

Several times during the year, members of Phoenix Explorers participate in community projects to support Alsager. In March this year, they worked with the Alsager Urban Wildlife Initiative to dig up a patch near the medical centre for the planting of wild line lowers designed to attract bees. Many thanks to Antony Cook and Hillary Robinson for working with all their work.

Chase Walk 2020

For the past ten years, Phoenix Explorers have taken part in the annual 40-mile Chase Walk held on Cannock Chase. This year, the unit made the decision to raise money for Alsager Swans, a local swimming club who provide swimming therapy for people of all ages with disabilities. Many thanks to everyone who participated in the event and for raising over £700 for the Swans.

When I took on this role in 2019, I was fully anticipating a normal quiet year, nobody could have anticipated the global shock that was heading towards all of us. A set of circumstances that I suspect are unique in the lifetime of everybody living today.

I am delighted to say that 1st Alsager Scout Group have risen to the occasion superbly well.

The first lockdown provided some considerable opportunities for work that needed doing in terms of maintenance to the Scout Hall, the main hall and hallway has been redecorated and a number of maintenance tasks have been undertaken.

The major external activity undertaken during the 1st lockdown was assisting the Alsager Round Table with the collection for Alsager Food Bank. The use of the hall was used to drop off the donations received from the public; the hall was literally filled to overflowing. A few leaders then dealt with the majority of the sorting of the food, which we then stored until the foodbank required it. This really was a marvellous demonstration of scouts helping others who are less fortunate than themselves.


